1. Welcome

 - This presentation provided an overview of the disability benefits system and the main difficulties faced by people with ME when applying for disability benefits.

- This presentation focused on the experience of applying for Personal Independence Payment (PIP) and Employment and Support Allowance (ESA) whilst having ME.
- c) Dr William Weir, Consultant Physician, Medical Adviser
 - This presentation focused on the issues faced by ME sufferers when claiming private insurance and also discussed the various medical perspectives on ME which influence the process of applying for disability benefits.
